

Overview

Disciple-Makers world wide are taking the command of Jesus in Luke 10:2 and Matthew 9:38 seriously. They are asking God earnestly - "beseeching" him - to thrust an unprecedented number of laborers into the ripe and ripening harvest fields. Whether you are a seasoned missionary or just starting to form a team to reach your neighborhood, this is a simple yet powerful habit to begin.

Understanding this Command

Jesus sent out the 12 (Luke 9-1-6) and then the 72 others (Luke 10:1) to prepare the way for every village and town Jesus would enter. Jesus observed that: "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few." He then commanded His disciples to: "Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field."

- 1. There is a great and ready harvest but far too few laborers.
- 2. The Lord of the harvest is up to the task of answering prayer and sending vast numbers of laborers into harvest in places all over the world.
- 3. We are not asking for laborers who need to be persuaded or convinced. We are asking for disciples-makers who are highly motivated for seeing God's Kingdom expand. (The Greek word for "Send Forth." is a very forceful, almost violent term. It is used for casting out a demon, for example.)

Getting Started

- 1. Set your watch alarm to go off at 10:02 every day. (You can use 9:38 based on Matthew's Gospel if you prefer).
- 2. When your alarm goes off, follow Jesus' simple command by praying for more laborers (disciple-makers) for the harvest.
- 3. Invite others to join you in this prayer. You may even want to call or text each other to agree in prayer together.

Helpful Tips

- 1. Don't think that since this is a simple prayer that it won't have significant results. There are numerous testimonies from around the world where missionaries started with this prayer and saw amazing results.
- 2. It is helpful to ask for a particular geographical area like your neighborhood, community or place of employment. This way you will see the answered prayer first hand.
- 3. This is not a one-time request. Consider the parable of the persistent widow in Luke 18. Don't give up even if you pray it 700 days in a row.
