

## How Jesus Taught Followers to Carry Out His Vision (Artwork and Figures)

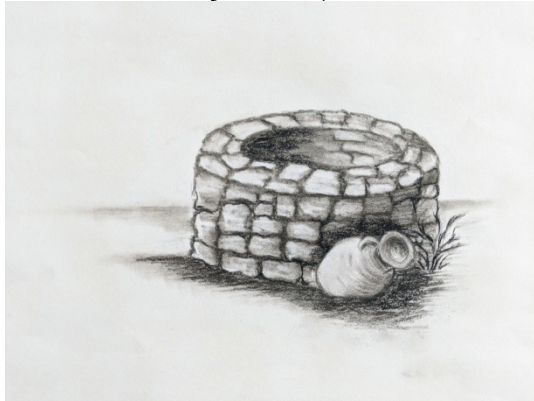
<p><b>Section 1</b></p> <p><b>Expressing His Vision</b></p> <p><i>“...but whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst.”</i> (John 4:14)</p> 	<p><b>Chapter 2: Discovering the Good Soil</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li><b>1. Discover What You Have in Common</b> – Don't be critical or judgmental.</li><li><b>2. Learn How to Transition</b> – Try to avoid awkward and abrupt transitions when bringing up a spiritual topic.</li><li><b>3. Avoid Monologues</b> – Engage in two-way dialogue.</li><li><b>4. Look for Spiritual interest</b> – Limit the spiritual information you present to what the person is ready for and interested in receiving.</li><li><b>5. Select Your Venue</b> – Take the initiative to invite conversations in quiet spaces.</li></ol>
<p><b>Chapter 3: The Beginning of the Gospel</b></p> <p><b>Five Gifts That Jesus Offered</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li><b>1. Living Water</b> – True satisfaction, continual refreshment, eternal life</li><li><b>2. Forgiveness</b> – Jesus forgave sins</li><li><b>3. Healing</b> – Jesus healed brokenness</li><li><b>4. Acceptance</b> – Jesus accepted all people regardless of social status</li><li><b>5. Care</b> – Jesus genuinely cared about people and addressed their needs</li></ol>	<p><b>Chapter 4: Healing at the Pool of Bethesda</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. We love God and have a relationship with Him.</li><li>2. God empowers us and directs our life.</li><li>3. We act on whatever God tells us to do.</li></ol> <p><b>Five Suggestions for Sharing the Message of Love</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Let Your Love Be Genuine</li><li>2. Share Sincerely</li><li>3. Love Humbly</li><li>4. Share Your Spirituality—NOT Your Religion</li><li>5. Be Careful with the Term “Christian”</li></ol>
<p><b>Chapter 5: Introducing God</b></p> <p><b>How to Respond to Jesus</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li><b>1. Get to Know Jesus</b> – Invite the seeker to connect with Jesus.</li><li><b>2. Ask Jesus for Help</b> – Invite the seeker to pray or ask for prayer.</li><li><b>3. Follow Jesus (Repent)</b> – Show the seeker how to begin a relationship with Jesus and put His teachings into practice.</li></ol>	<p><b>Chapter 6: PERR – Steps to Getting Started</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li><b>1. Pray</b> – Ask God for eyes to see your neighbor's needs and where He is working.</li><li><b>2. Engage</b> – Take the initiative to start developing relationships with your neighbors.</li><li><b>3. Reveal</b> – Share about yourself, including your spirituality.</li><li><b>4. Respond</b> – Listen to your friends, care about them, bless them, and share about God's gifts.</li></ol>

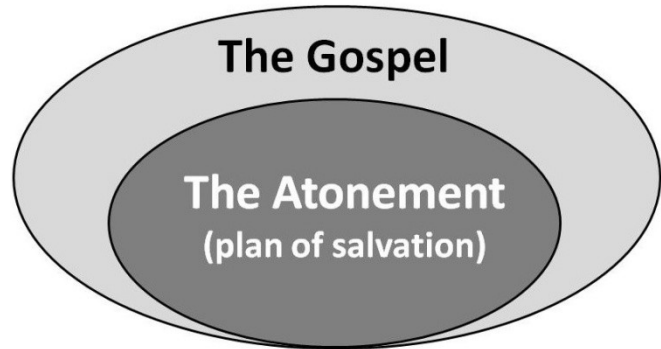

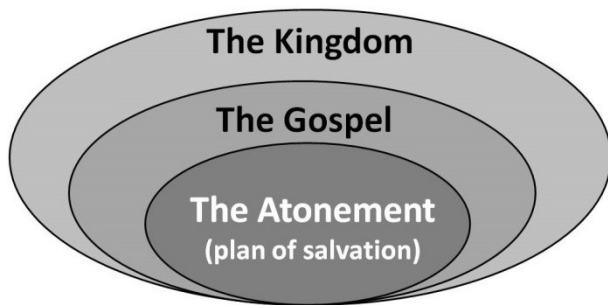

# What is The Gospel?



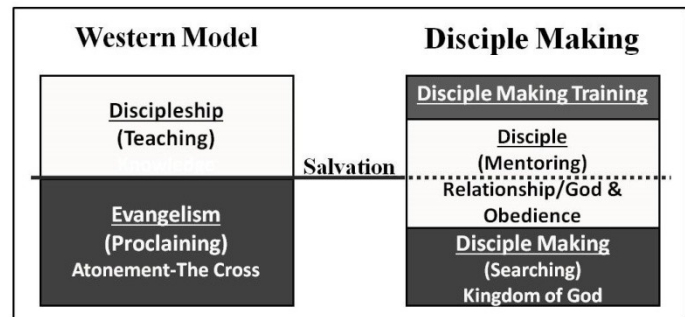

# What is The Gospel Message?



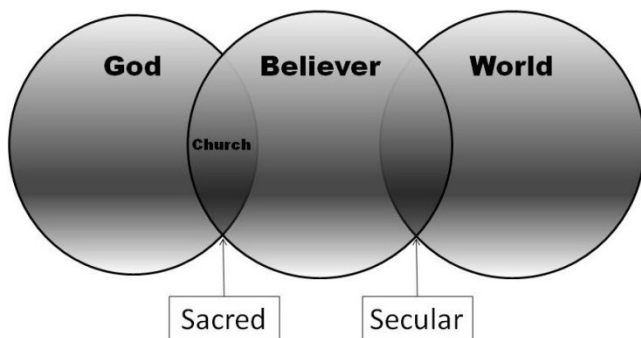

# The Great Commission



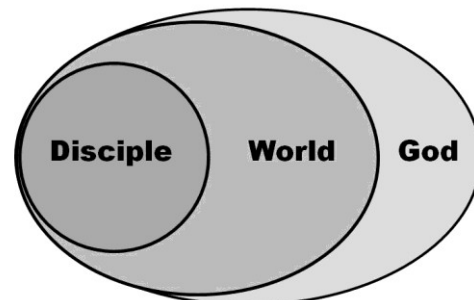

# Life of a Christian

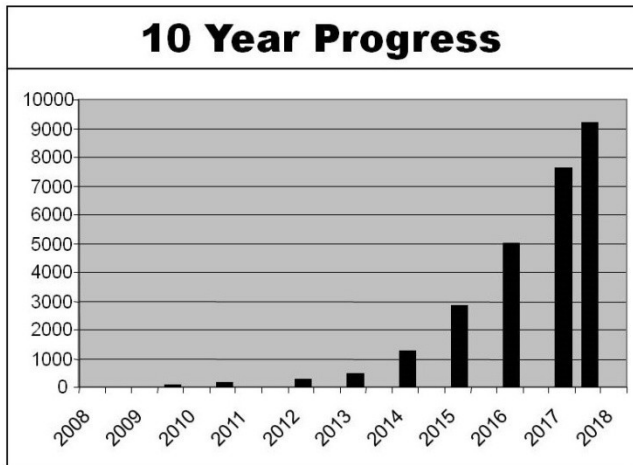

# Incarnational Disciple-Making

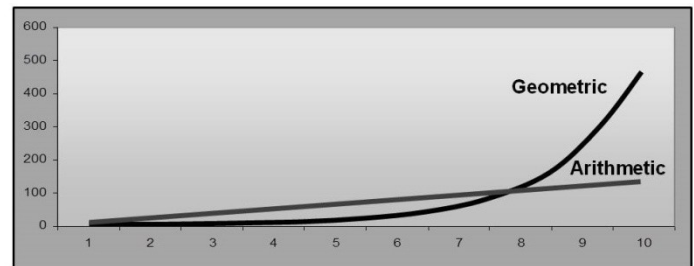

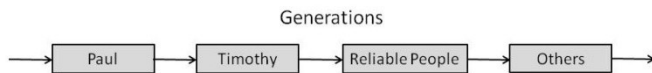

## Chapter 11: Discovering God

### Three goals for a disciple-making tool:

- \* For disciples to learn to listen for specific revelation and obey God
- \* For disciples to develop a dependency on God
- \* To be easily replicated so the disciple can make other disciples

### Divide a piece of paper into four columns.

Label columns: 1) **Passage** 2) **Own Words** 3) **Discovery Questions** 4) **Actions: I Will**

Column 1: Write all or a key part of the passage word-for-word from the Bible.

Column 2: Write the same verses in your own words.

Column 3: Write answers to the 3 Discovery Questions.

- What does this story teach us about God?
- What does this story teach us about people?
- What do you think God wants people to do as a result of reading this passage?

Column 4: Write your answers to the 3 Action Questions.

- What action do you think God wants you to take as a result of reading this?
- What will you do? (Start your answer with: "I will...")
- Who else can you share about your experience with God through this passage?
- Would you like to do this again next week?
